Job Vacancy: Invasive Species Program Support Specialist - Seasonal, May 2026 - August 2026

Required Qualifications: High school diploma. Ability to read, understand, and communicate technical language as it applies to modern invasive species control methods, ability to operate tools and equipment used in invasive species control programs, ability to traverse extended distances over uneven terrain, education and/or experience in biological sciences or other related fields.

Preferred Qualifications: Training or experience in rangeland plant identification, insect identification, and field data collection. Experience operating ATV's.

JOB SUMMARY

Sheridan County Weed and Pest (SCWP) is seeking an enthusiastic and driven invasive species program support specialist to assist the district in implementation of district programs in accordance with local, state, and federal guidelines.

The main duties and responsibilities of the Invasive Species Program Support Specialist will be to conduct inventories of invasive species including state and county designated and declared noxious species. The average work day will be spent working independently or with a partner surveying for invasive species on the Bighorn National Forest by foot or UTV. Infestations will be recorded using GPS and GIS applications.

Secondary responsibilities will be to participate in the following district programs when time allows: leafy spurge biocontrol, mosquito biocontrol, weed-free product certification. The successful applicant, under the direction of the district supervisor, shall assist with collection and identification of weed and insect specimens, testing of mosquitoes for presence of West Nile virus, distribution and monitoring of leafy spurge beetles, equipment maintenance and repair, public interaction and education, and more. Other duties include, but are not limited to, field data collection, reports, grant applications, and data compilation. Duties will be highly variable depending on season and need. Specific training in invasive species programs will be provided by SCWP.
